Occasionally assist with office tasks such as mailings, copying, filing, cutting, folding, etc. to support our Religious Education program. This could be during the week or during Wednesday evening class times.

Childcare Provider

Care for younger children of catechists during classroom sessions or meetings. Commitment of Wednesday afternoons and/or evenings during the school year.

Substitute Catechist

*Christ Renews His Parish (C.R.H.P.)

Christ Renews His Parish is a copyrighted parish renewal process that has existed since 1969 and been recommended by the renewal office of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops and Archbishop Naumann.

Men and women of the parish attend separate renewal weekends led by fellow parishioners under Fr. Storey and Deacon Jim's guidance. CRHP is based on Word and Sacrament and uses much prayer, scripture, sharing and liturgy. It allows for parishioners to deepen their relationship with Christ. The weekend also offers an excellent opportunity to get to know other people of the parish.

Christ Renews His Parish is structured so that it becomes part of normal parish life without becoming another parish organization. It supports other parish organizations and ministries and sends renewed parishioners into these groups. The whole process is much more than just a weekend experience.

*Vacation Bible School (V.B.S.)

Our parish offers a week of VBS each summer to children entering into K-5th grades in the fall. Approximately 200 students attend each year. Our students will learn scripture stories, virtues and lives of the saints, all re-enforced through music, games, crafts and interactive skits. There is a need for a great number of volunteers to make this all happen. The program takes place mornings 8:30-12:00 for one week in June.

V.B.S. MC (Master of Ceremonies)

Lead the children in learning songs and introduce the daily Bible point during the opening and closing sessions each day.

V.B.S. Class Leaders

In charge of a class of approximately 15 students for the week directing their class to the various stations: activities, snacks, outside games and Bible Adventure as well as teaching the Saint of the day. Commitment is 5 hours pre-program then each day of VBS.

V.B.S.Craft/Activity Leaders

In charge of planning crafts and activities for the week of VBS, purchasing necessary supplies and leading the team of volunteers. Commitment includes time spent planning as well as the week of VBS.

V.B.S. Skit Coordinator

Works with youth volunteers during VBS to put on skits for the opening and closing sessions each day.

V.B.S. Snack Coordinator

Plans, buys and distributes snacks the week of VBS.

V.B.S. Outside Games Coordinator

Plans and oversees the outside games the week of VBS.

V.B.S. Bible Adventure Leaders

Teach the daily scripture story through interactive skits the week of VBS.

V.B.S. Youth Volunteers

For students entering grades 7 on up. Youth volunteers help in all aspects of VBS: classroom aides, outdoor games, skits, crafts & activities, nursery and Bible Adventures.

*Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Classes that help children encounter the living God through presentations based on the Bible and Liturgy. Children and catechists nurture their relationship with Jesus within a prepared environment (atrium). Must be Virtus trained.

Good Shepherd Catechist

A teacher who works in the Catechesis atrium, an environment specially prepared with age appropriate materials in this Montessori based religious formation program. Class times vary throughout the week during the school year. Must go through formal training given by the National Association of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd.

Good Shepherd Catechist Aides

Assist the catechist and the children in the atrium. Help by reading scripture to young children, light candles for prayer, sharpen pencils, maintain supplies, etc.

Carpenters

Make materials used by children in the atrium, for example, a small altar table, sacristy cabinet, shelving, dioramas, small lectern, hinged boxes, and other miscellaneous projects. Specific dimensions and patterns are available.

Seamstresses

Sew simple, small priest vestments, small altar cloths, and small tablecloths for a child.

*School of Faith:

School of Faith is a public association of the faithful that provides ongoing adult catechesis throughout the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas. It provides ongoing formation to the teachers in all 44 of the Catholic schools throughout the Archdiocese of Kansas City, Kansas.

School of Faith offers doctrinal and spiritual formation for Catholics through catechetical programs that stress the call to prayer, virtue, and holiness of life, with a particular emphasis on mentoring those who have the responsibility to teach the faith to others.

School of Faith is a program of adult catechesis primarily designed to provide doctrinal and spiritual formation for Catholic school teachers, administrators, spiritual mentors and individuals. Its purpose is to lay the theological foundation upon which an authentic Catholic culture can be developed. It is comprehensive in its content, but always with the goal of explaining the faith in a simple and engaging way.

As stressed by the Church at the Second Vatican Council, Catholic schools have the task of leading young people to a deep encounter with Jesus Christ. This entails providing them an apprenticeship in Christian living as well as renewing Catholic culture through the development of the physical, intellectual, moral, social and especially spiritual capacities of the next generation.


Cub Scout Pack Leadership
